SCHOOL PROFILE

Named after Tennessee's first governor, William Blount High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 1,613 students in grades 9–12. The average senior class for the last 4 years (classes of 2017-2021) has graduated 93.7% of its students. William Blount is accredited by AdvancED, with the most recent accreditation cycle to be completed in December of 2021.

Spanning 567 square miles, Blount County School District serves the educational needs of Blount County's western residents

Currently, the district consists of four high schools, five middle schools and 14 elementary schools utilizing a K–5, 6–8, 9–12 grade-level configuration. The student body's ethnic makeup is 95% Caucasian, 2% African American, 2% Hispanic and 1% Asian. Of our 1,613 students, 19% are economically disadvantaged.

WBHS CURRICULUM

The academic program is organized on a rotating block schedule. Five credits per semester is the maximum course load; students take five 67-minute block classes and attend a 25 minute academic enrichment each day. Most University and Honors level courses, and all Advanced Placement courses, are yearlong and students earn two credits for the class (an "A" and "B" credit). All other courses are semester long and students earn one credit.

Weighted *and* Unweighted Points

Each honors class grade carries a weight of .5 points. Each AP class grade carries a weight of 1 point. Weighted points are not calculated until final grades are stored. William Blount High School utilizes the state of Tennessee Uniform Grading Policy, which represents the grading system currently in use by all LEAs serving students in grades 9-12.

2 Grade Point Average and (GPA) Calculation

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 28 credits is required for graduation. Grades are recorded on the transcript and a cumulative GPA is computed each January and May.


Academic Recognition

Blount County Schools neither ranks students numerically, nor names a valedictorian and salutatorian. For honors recognition, we use the following Latin System, which is the average weighted GPA based on the first 7 semesters of course work:

- Summa Cum Laude (with highest honors): 4.35 and above
- Magna Cum Laude (with high honors): 4.175 4.34
- Cum Laude (with honors): 3.95 4.174

REQUIREMENTS for **GRADUATION**

The State of Tennessee and Blount County Schools require 28 credits for graduation, which must include the following:





*1 credit of World History & Geography, 1 credit of US History, minimum .5 credit of US Government, .5 credit of Economics, and .5 credit of Personal Finance.
